Acetate Renew is an innovative material that marries bio-based content derived from sourced wood pulp with ISCC certified recycled plastic waste. This is made possible through **molecular recycling technology**, a cutting-edge process that breaks down hard-to-recycle plastics into their fundamental molecular building blocks. These recycled components are then used to create new, high-quality acetate that's identical in performance and appearance to conventional acetate.

Our Commitment to Traceability: ISCC PLUS Certification

Transparency and accountability are paramount to our sustainability efforts. The Acetate Renew used in Mulberry eyewear is **ISCC PLUS¹ (International Sustainability & Carbon Certification)** certified. This globally recognized certification ensures the traceability and sustainability of materials throughout our supply chain. Frame Material Composition: A Closer Look

We believe in full transparency regarding the materials we use. The Acetate Renew in our frames is meticulously composed:

43 % bio- based cellulose from wood pulp.

27% ISCC PLUS-certified recycled material (mass balance approach)

30% plasticizers, stabilizers and pigments.

Understanding the Mass Balance Approach

The mass balance approach is a chain of custody method used to trace the flow of alternative feedstocks through complex value chains. During the production process, certified feedstocks are mixed with conventional materials, resulting in products that are physically indistinguishable from those made solely from conventional feedstocks.

This method is vital for scaling up the use of alternative materials, as it avoids the need for entirely separate, inefficient production lines. It ensures that for every kilogram of certified material entering our system, an equivalent amount is accounted for in our certified products, maintaining environmental integrity and verifiable claims.

By leveraging circular materials like Acetate Renew and adopting robust certification systems, De Rigo reinforces Mulberry's profound commitment to a more sustainable future.
